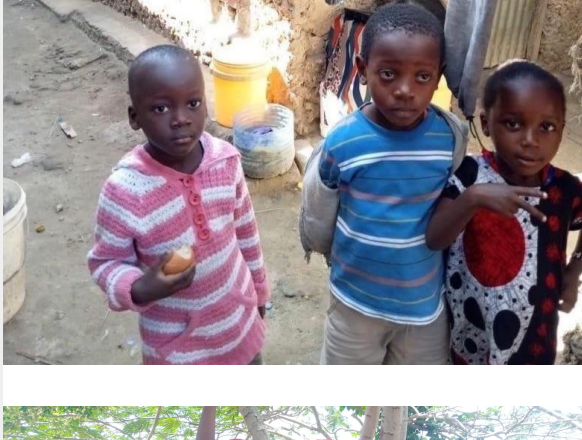

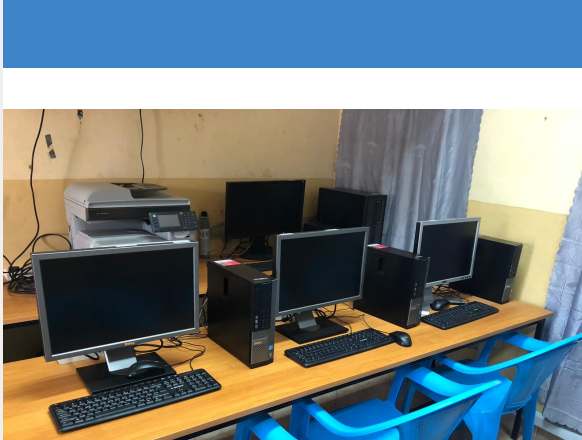
## Tutorial Sessions

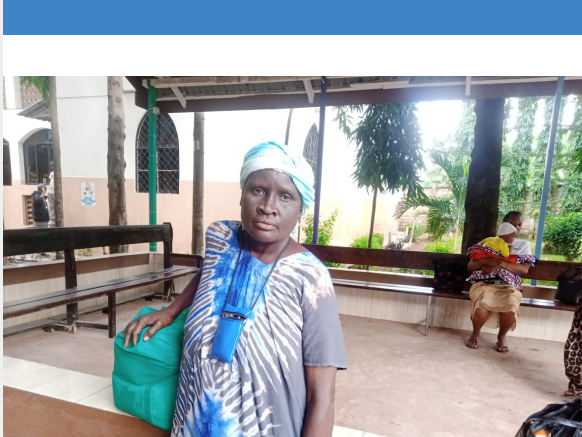
## New Computers

The cost of food continues to go up due to inflation, weather conditions, and supply chain issues. Families do not have the financial means to withstand the price increases and therefore often have to go without meals. We continue to give out food monthly to help struggling families.



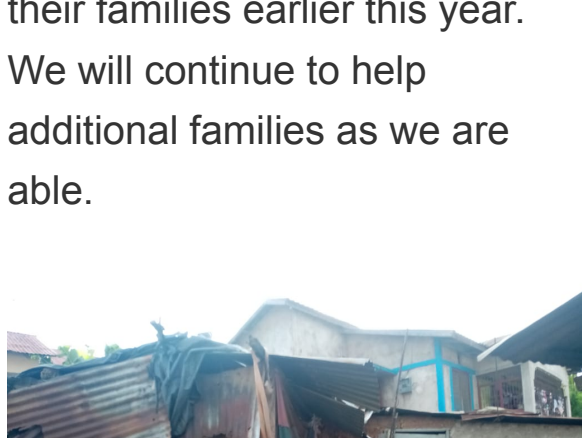
## Backpacks

## Mattresses

Not only are many of the homes of our students in very bad shape, but many of the families of our students sleep on the floor as they cannot afford mattresses. We began giving out mattresses to students and their families earlier this year. We will continue to help additional families as we are able.
