




In 2025 ...

- We supported 240 vulnerable children in school
- Provided over 200 uniforms and pairs of shoes
- Gave out 910 bags (over 12.5 tons) of food
- Built 3 houses and 4 outdoor toilets for families
- Ran 70 tutorial sessions across 2 locations
- Provided 36 beds and mattresses to children
- Helped 3 recent graduates start small businesses
- Installed solar panels and lighting for 17 families
- Brought 35 new students into the project
- Provided 7 200-liter water tanks to families
- Gave out 20 solar lamps to families
- Hosted 4 meetings with parents and guardians
- Relocated the project offices to our new facility

New Project Offices

In December, we moved our project offices and classrooms into a new facility, which features an office and waiting area, two classrooms, a kitchen, a storage room, and restrooms. The new building will enable us to better meet the needs of our students and their families.



A New Home for Fatuma, Hamisi, and Bahati

In November, we built a new house for Fatuma, who is a widow, and her two children, Hamisi and Bahati. The mud house they were living in collapsed (first picture below) and the family was homeless. In addition, we built the family an outdoor latrine, as there is no running water, and installed a solar panel and lights, as there is no electricity in the area.




Helping Safari Start a Welding Business

Safari graduated with a degree in welding in September. We then helped him start his own welding business by providing him with tools and materials. Safari is one of six children, most of whom did not have the opportunity to attend school.



Solar Panels and Lights

One of our major initiatives in 2025 was installing solar panels and lights in the homes of our students and their families who live without electricity. We installed 14 solar panels in the fourth quarter and 17 total for the year. Families really appreciate having lighting when it gets dark.



Helping Students Learn

We ran tutorial session for our students every Saturday. In addition, we ran three weeks (Monday - Thursday) of tutorial sessions in November to end the year. The students have access to our library of reference materials, computers, and tablets. We also bring in teachers from local schools to work with the students in a more personalized environment than they get in school.



Providing Food to the Hungry

We gave out 70 bags of food each month to ensure families have enough food to eat. This includes, rice, beans, wheat flour, corn flour, oil, and milk. We also give out soap and sanitary pads. In addition, we distributed food for Christmas that included a fresh whole chicken.



Beds and Mattresses

We provided two single mothers with three beds and mattresses for their families in the fourth quarter.





Uniforms and Shoes for the New School Year

The academic school year in Kenya starts in January. We measured students for new uniforms and shoes in October and gave out new shoes to over 150 students in November.



New School Supplies

In November, we gave out school supplies to students to get them ready for the new school year that begins in January.



Preparing our Students for Standardized Exams

Students in sixth and ninth grades take national exams that determine which junior secondary and senior secondary schools they can attend. We prepare our students for the exams by tutoring them and providing them with the required supplies.

Outhouses

As most of our students and their families live in houses without running water, we build outdoor toilets for them, in addition to building new homes. In the fourth quarter, we built two outhouses - one for Warda, Hamisi Omar, and Idd Ali, who live with their grandmother (new and old outhouses pictured below), and the one for Fatuma, Hamisi, and Bahati with their new house (shown above).

Water Tanks

We provided five families with 200-liter water tanks in the fourth quarter. Most of our families live in homes without running water. The water tanks provide a clean, safe place to store water for drinking and cooking.

Giving Thanks

We ended off the year with a Thanksgiving Mass to give thanks to God for all his gifts. This was followed by an end-of-year celebration with singing, dancing, and lots of food.
