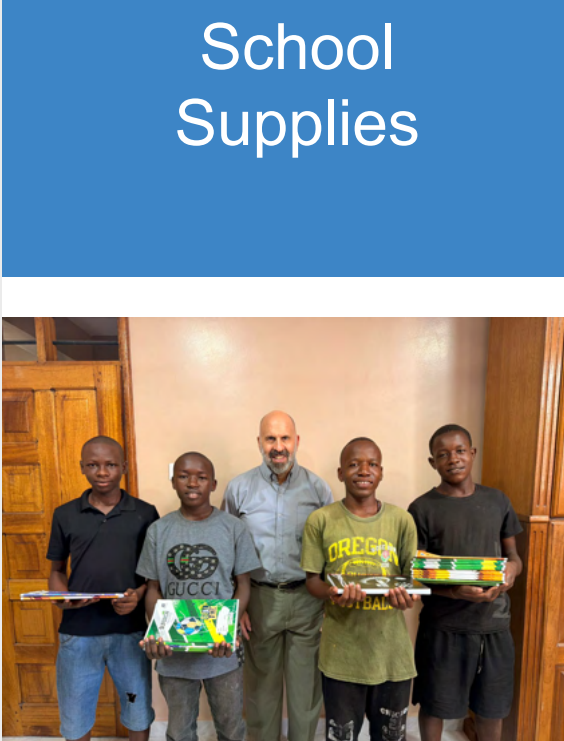
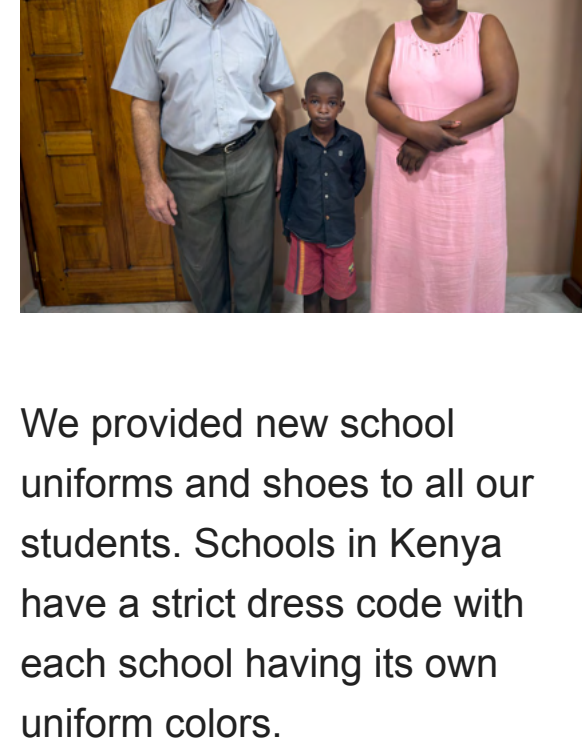
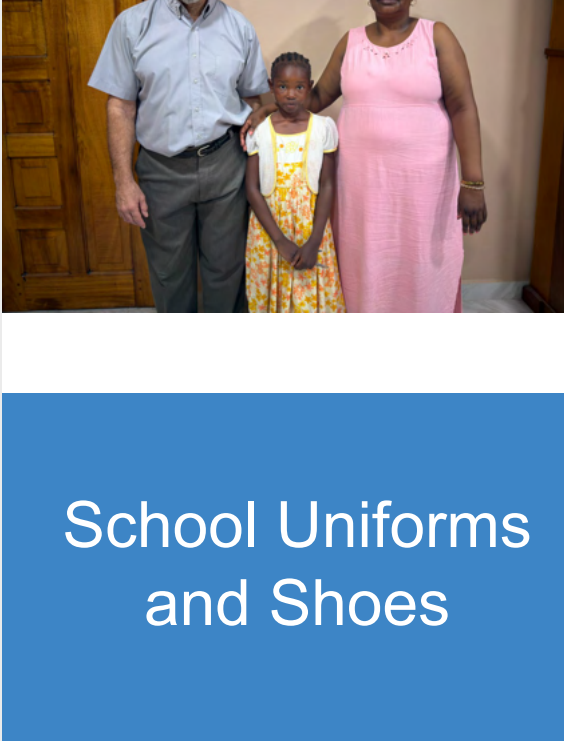


In the first quarter of 2026

- We supported 239 vulnerable children in school
- Admitted 35 new students into the project
- Paid school fees for 212 students
- Provided 239 uniforms and 109 pairs of shoes
- Gave out school supplies to 239 students
- Provided backpacks to 125 students
- Distributed 210 bags (almost 3 tons) of food
- Ran 12 tutorial sessions across 2 locations
- Provided 9 beds and mattresses for children
- Installed solar panels and lighting for 5 families
- Gave out 20 solar lights to families

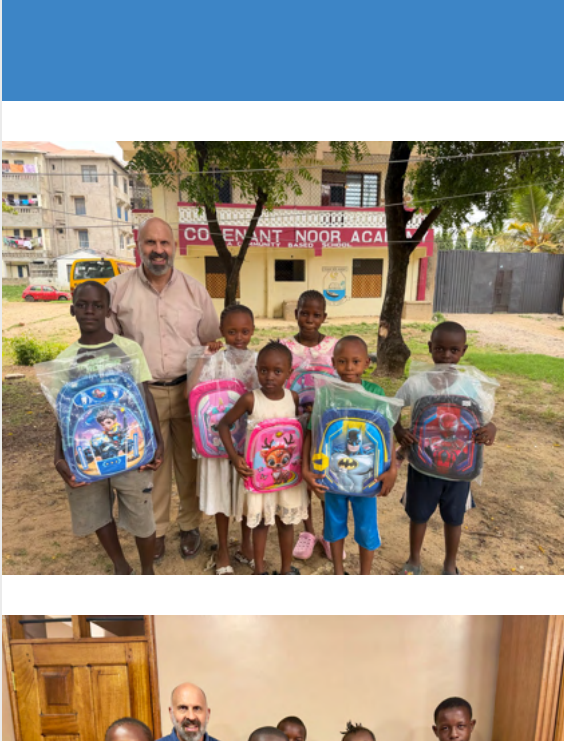
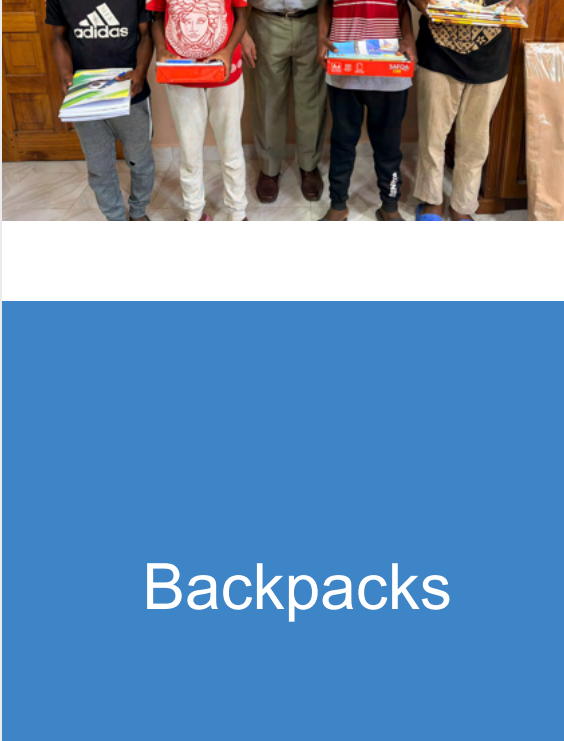
## New Students

We brought in 35 new students into the project in the first quarter. These children were either not in school, or their parents or guardians were not able to continue paying their school fees.



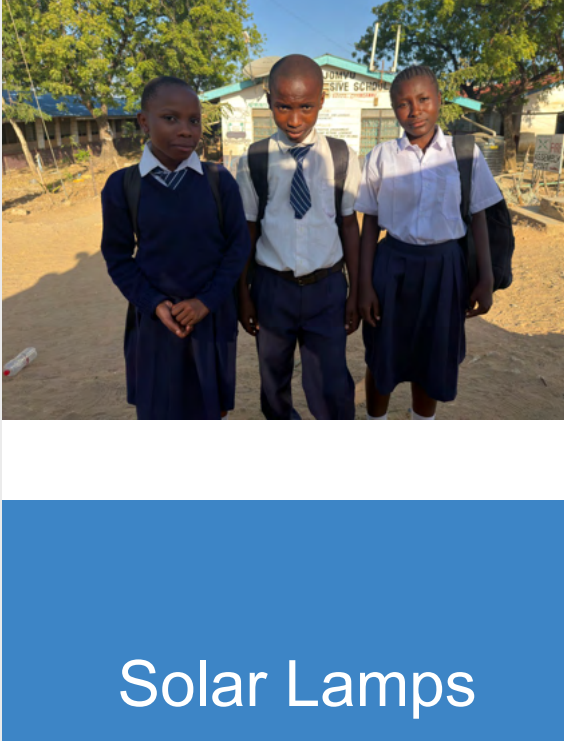
## School Uniforms and Shoes

We provided new school uniforms and shoes to all our students. Schools in Kenya have a strict dress code with each school having its own uniform colors.



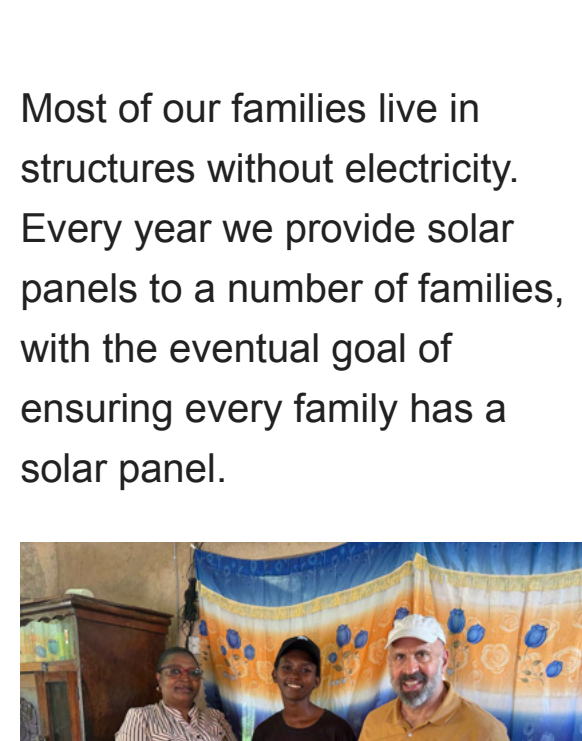
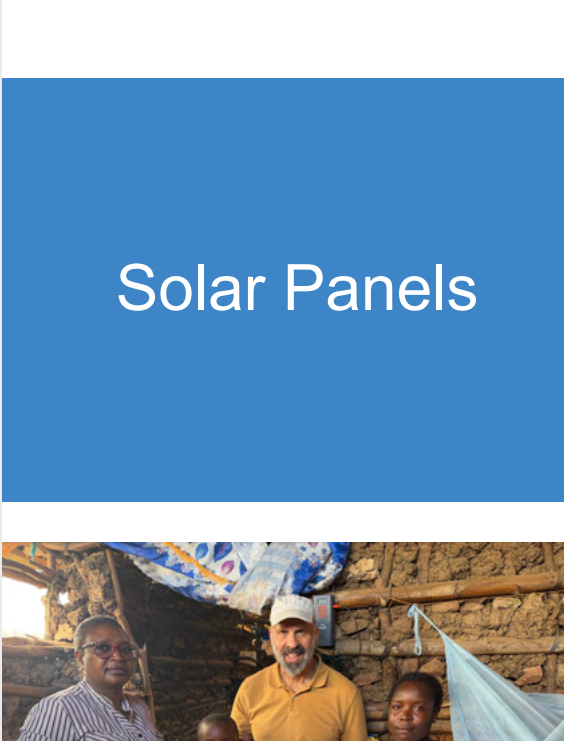
## School Supplies

We give every student all the supplies they need for school – everything from notebooks, to paper, to pens and pencils. Each school has very specific requirements.



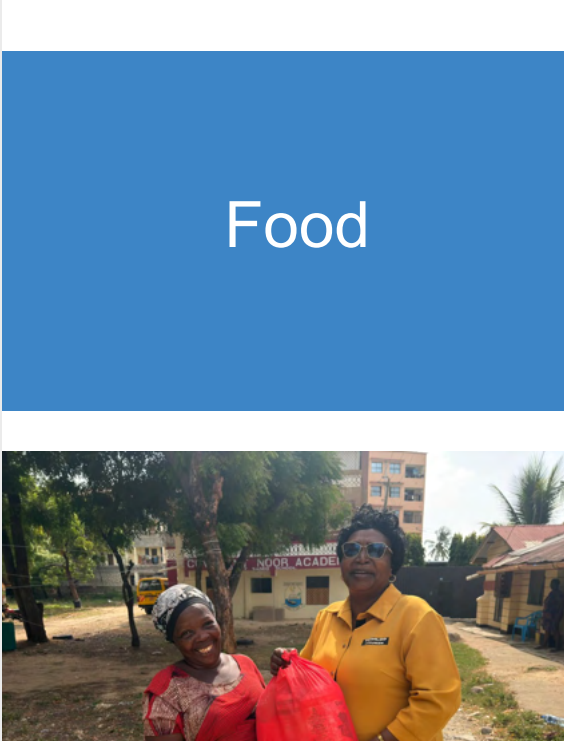
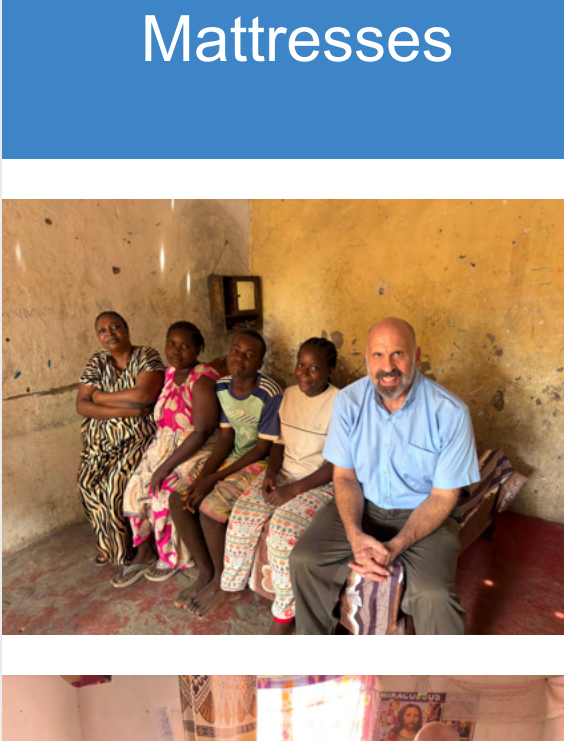
## Backpacks

We make sure every student has a backpack to carry books and school supplies. We buy new backpacks every few years to replace old, worn-out ones. In addition, we give new backpacks to new students entering the project. We gave out 125 backpacks in the first quarter.



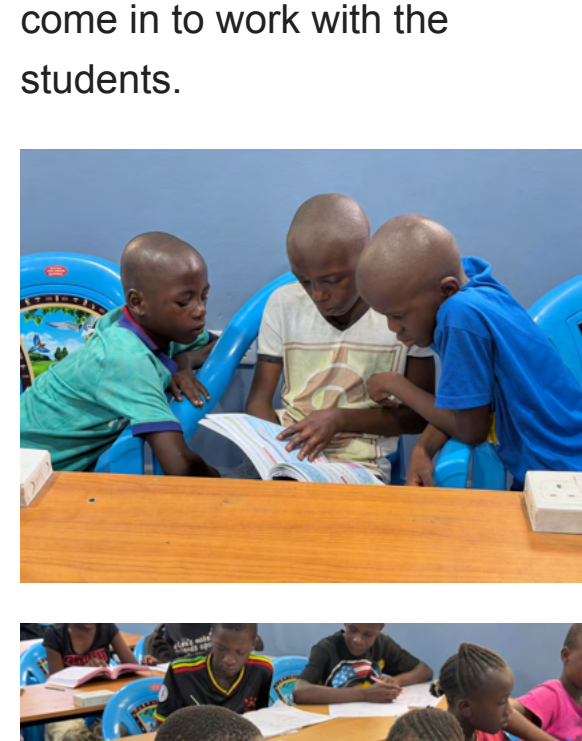
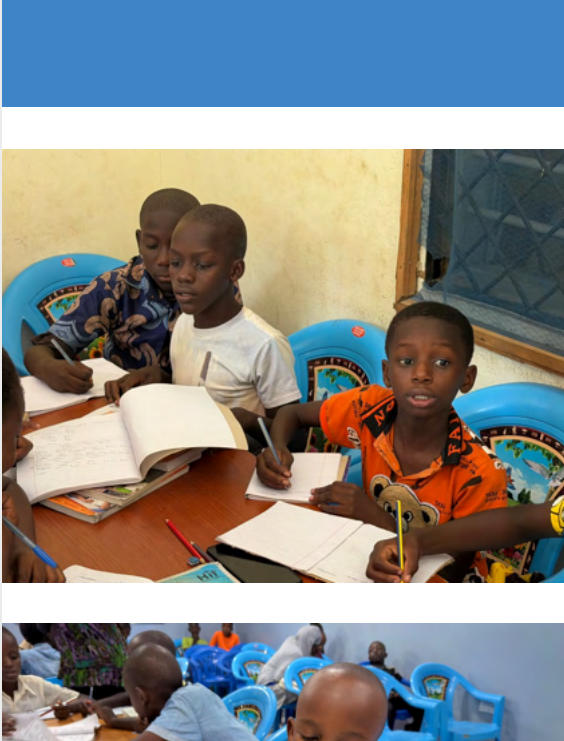
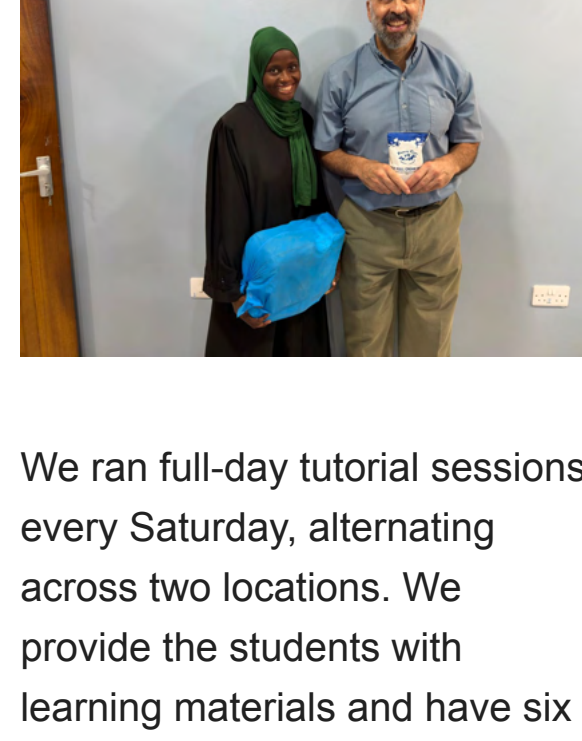
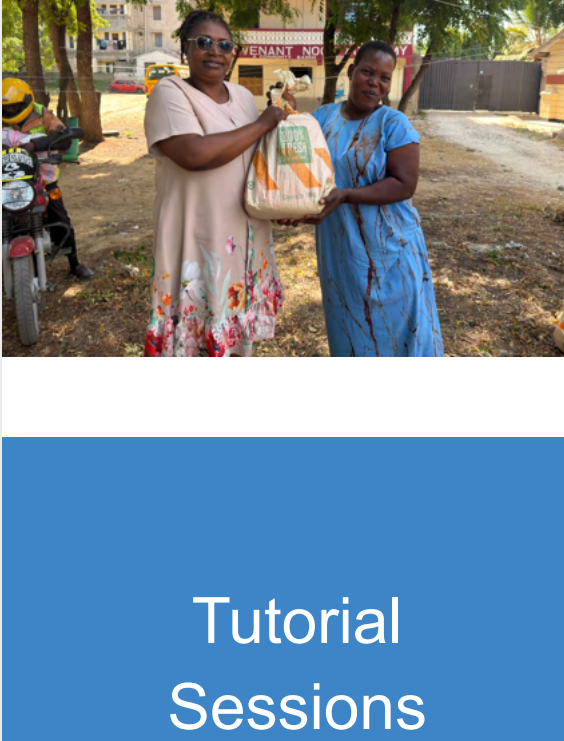
## School Visits

We visit every pre-primary, secondary, and junior secondary school once a term to talk to teachers, check on the progress of our students, and pay school fees. In the first quarter of 2026, we visited 59 schools.



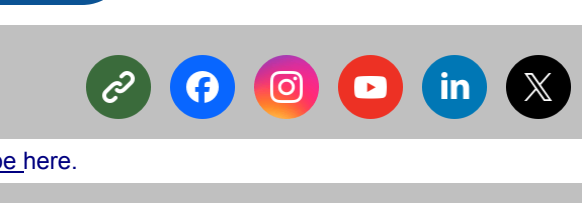
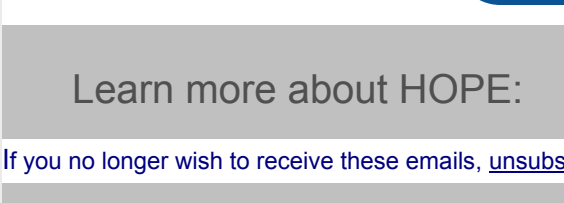
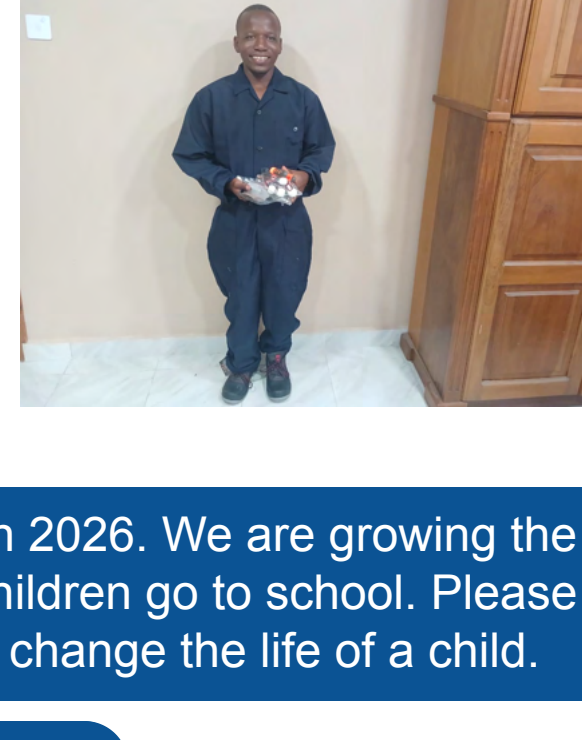
## Solar Lamps

We gave out 20 solar lamps to the families of our new students in the first quarter. We make sure every one of our HOPE families has a solar lamp and replace them every few years.



## Solar Panels

Most of our families live in structures without electricity. Every year we provide solar panels to a number of families, with the eventual goal of ensuring every family has a solar panel.



## Bed and Mattresses

We gave out 9 beds and mattresses in the first quarter of 2026 to families who were sleeping on the ground or on old beat-up mattresses.



## Food

We continue to give out 70 bags of food to each week to needy families. The food means so much to these families and helps to make sure they don't need to skip meals.



## Tutorial Sessions

We ran full-day tutorial sessions every Saturday, alternating across two locations. We provide the students with learning materials and have six teachers from local schools come in to work with the students.



## Learning Job Skills

We give every student the opportunity to go to college or vocational school so that they can acquire marketable job skills. We currently have eight students in college and six in vocational school. Ben is studying electrical installation and Alex recently started motor vehicle mechanic's school.
