

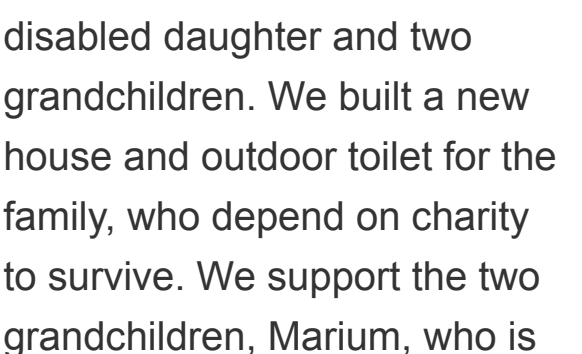
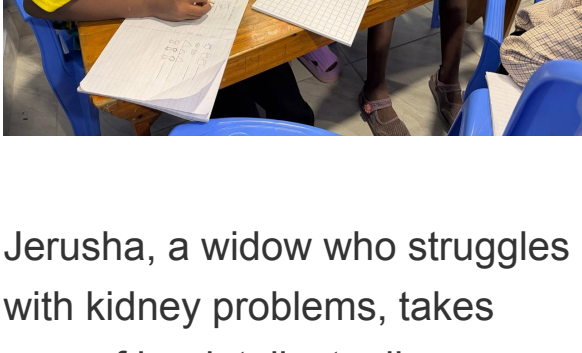
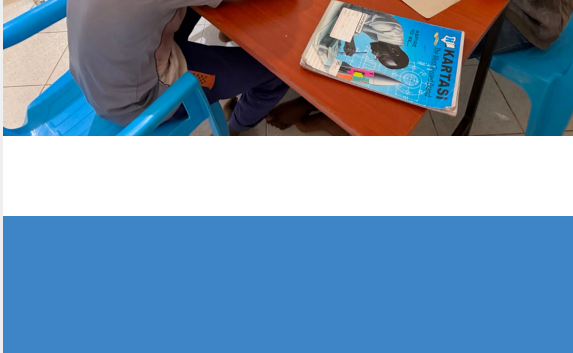
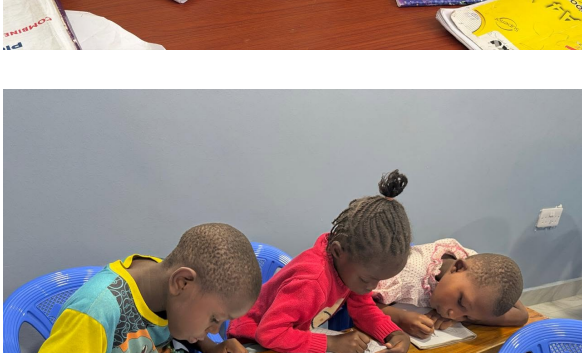


In the second quarter of 2026

- We supported 252 vulnerable children in school
- Accepted 15 new students into the project
- Built a new home and outdoor toilet for a family
- Helped one student start a small business
- Paid second term school fees for 222 students
- Distributed 210 bags (almost 3 tons) of food
- Ran 21 tutorial sessions across 2 locations
- Gave out 78 mosquito nets to help prevent malaria
- Provided 8 beds and mattresses to children
- Installed solar panels and lighting for 5 families
- Ran 2 workshops for the parents across 2 locations
- Provided supplies to 4 vocational school students
- Gave out backpacks to 11 students
- Gave out 10 chairs to families who have no furniture

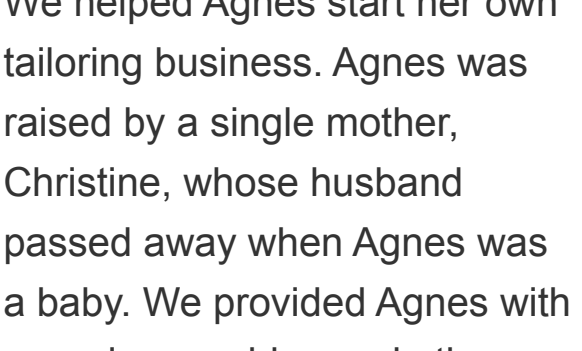
Helping Students Learn

We ran 21 tutorial sessions across our two locations in the second quarter. This included every Saturday as well as Monday through Thursday during the three-week term break in April between the first and second term of the school year.



A New Home for Jerusha and her Family

Jerusha, a widow who struggles with kidney problems, takes care of her intellectually disabled daughter and two grandchildren. We built a new house and outdoor toilet for the family, who depend on charity to survive. We support the two grandchildren, Marium, who is 15 years old and in grade 9, and Gift, who is 10 years old and in grade 3, in school.



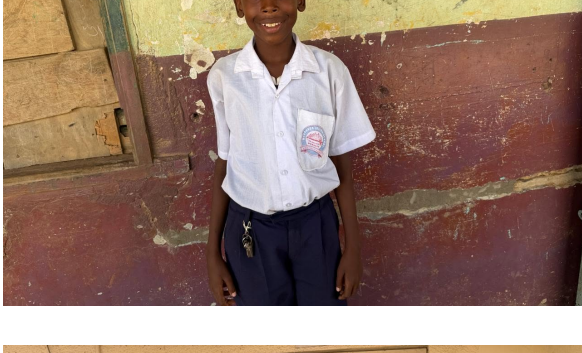
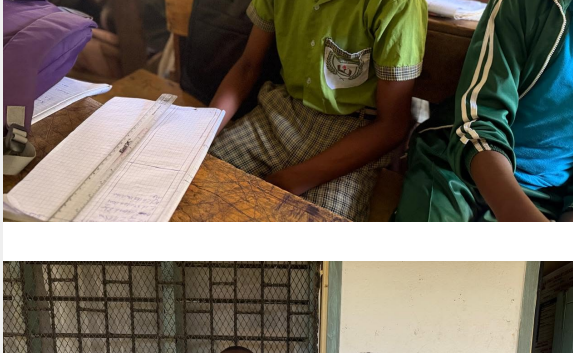
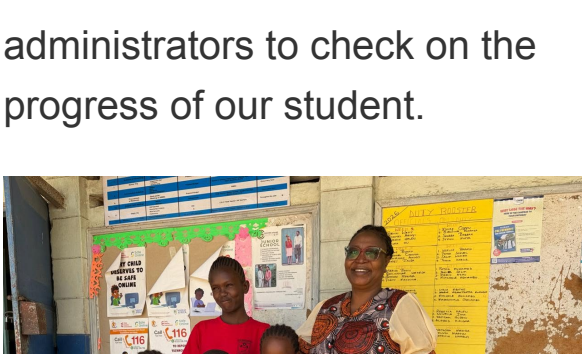
Helping Agnes Start a Small Business

We helped Agnes start her own tailoring business. Agnes was raised by a single mother, Christine, whose husband passed away when Agnes was a baby. We provided Agnes with a sewing machine and other materials and supplies to get her business started. She has already started making school uniforms and dresses (as shown in the pictures below).



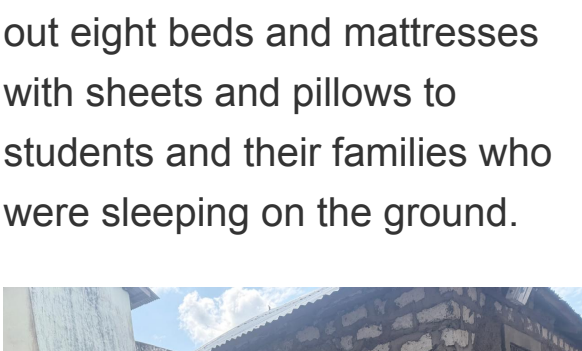
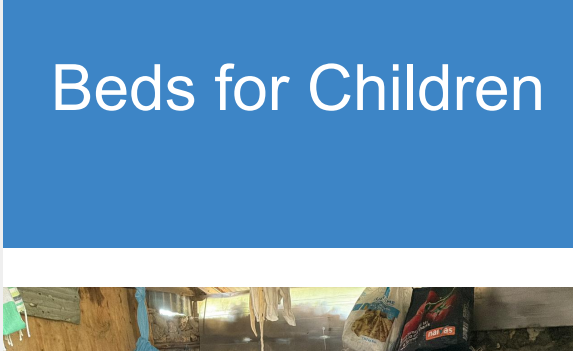
Supporting More Students in School

We paid second term school fees for 218 students (107 pre-primary and primary, 79 junior-secondary, 15 senior high school, 10 vocational, 4 college, and 3 special needs students). We also met with teachers and administrators to check on the progress of our student.



Beds for Children

In the second quarter, we gave out eight beds and mattresses with sheets and pillows to students and their families who were sleeping on the ground.



Some of Our New Students

Amina is a 27-year-old single mother who washes clothes to provide for her children. The HOPE Project supports Rashid, 6 years old and in pre-primary school, Salim, seven years old and in pre-primary school, Mwanahamisi, 10 years old and in fourth grade, and Rama, 13 years old and in fifth grade.



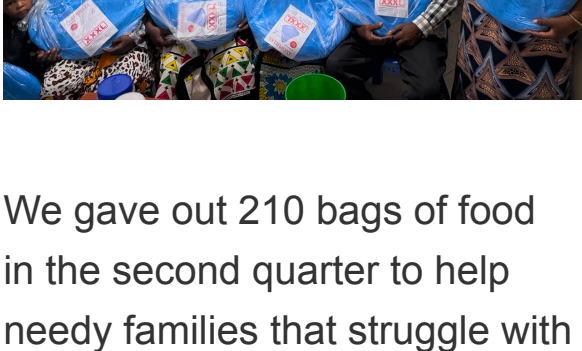
Solar Panels

We installed portable solar panels in the homes of five of our children who live in houses without electricity. Each solar panel comes with three lights to help the children study at night, and families cook their meals in the evening.



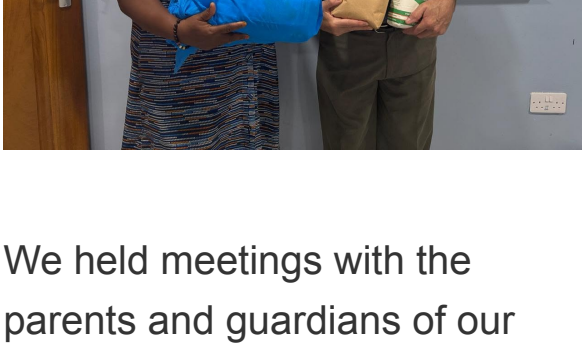
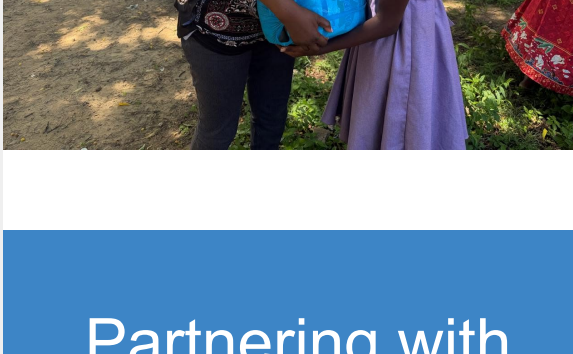
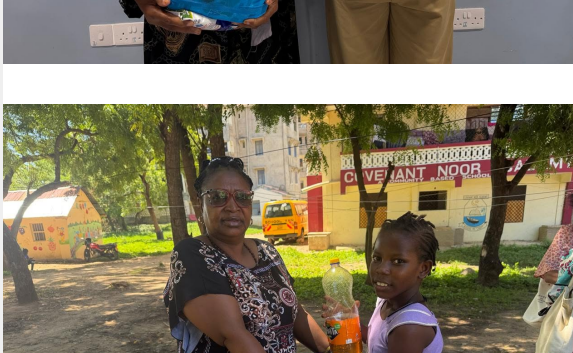
Mosquito Nets

In Mombasa, it is imperative to sleep under a mosquito net to help prevent malaria. We provided mosquito nets to 78 families in the second quarter.



Food Assistance

We gave out 210 bags of food in the second quarter to help needy families that struggle with food insecurity.
